Hi Clubsters!

Mimi and I had a great time at the International Meet this year.

We, plus Ken drove to our place in Sar Valley, Az. the first night. There we loaded up our 1924 Light Six Touring (Jack)

on Ken's trailer after checking the trailer and car for any potential problems. We also picked up our son and his bride in Phoenix. They had flown in from Minneapolis to drive Bob's 39 Ford home. Then off to Tucomcari where we discovered a great Mexican restaurant called La Cita.

After a long day of driving we made it to Overland Park, a suburb of Kansas City, and had dinner with our inlaws. We hadn't seen them in three years so it was good to catch up.

We had planned to pick up Michele at the Des Moines airport but she had to help her parents move so she couldn't come. We arrived in Debuque Sunday afternoon and registered for the ASC Meet. (For those wondering, there are 3 Studebaker Clubs: The Antique Studebaker Club for cars through 1946 and trucks through 1948, SDC for all Studebakers, and The Avanti International Owners Association for Avantis.) Debuque is a beautiful town made up of lots of beautiful buildings from the late 1800's to early 1900's. It is on the Mississippi River and was home to shipbuilding, mining, farming, and shipping. Tourism appears to be the principle business now.

Monday morning found us at the ASC Annual Bored Meeting where lots of important business was conducted. After lunch we drove out to the Field of Dreams. This is the location where the 1989 film starring Kevin Costner was filmed. We had a great presentation by one of the Ghost Players who sold his adjoining farm just to travel around the world performing for the troops. Monday night was the ASC Auction where people specialize in bidding outrageous amounts for things they don't need. What fun!

Tuesday morning, after breakfast with Ricky Logier, we went to a private auto collection of about 80 cars. The owner entertained Mimi and I, telling us stories about how he had acquired them. Sunday we made tracks to Salina, Kansas, home to Mc Pherson College (where the only automotive restoration degree in the country can be earned). We toured The Garage, a relatively new museum with an eclectic collection of interesting cars.

Monday it was hot with a strong headwind. Mileage towing the trailer went from our normal 16 to 12 with the truck's transmission seldom shifting into high gear. Fortunately La Cita awaited us in Tucumcari. Tuesday was Star Valley, Wednesday home.



I stopped in Casa Grande AZ Desert Valley Auto Salvage to look for Studebaker parts did find a 2R11 truck rim & a Studebaker Champion 6 blade engine fan off a 1948 Champion, but prices are high.



I Then drove to Sunset TX Browne Auto Salvage looking for Studebaker parts. This yard is huge well over 3,000 cars. Lots of 1940-1966 Studebaker cars & trucks but many have been picked over already.
