In December 2022, I was contacted by Bob Robinson to give him advice on selling his 1962 GT Hawk, This was a family owned car. Bob was raised in Velva North Dalota, 90 miles form the Canadian Border. His dad had a dealership only prior to WW2. Bob's dad got this car from the South Bend Studebaker Factory. His parents kept it until 1973. It was driven all over the country, accumulating about 85,000 miles. Bob's father passed away in 1980. Bob's mom kept it in Velva, ND. It was maintained and used in parades. Bob's mom passed in 2002 and he got the car in 2003. He was living in San Diego and worked for the Union Tribune. Bob occasionally drove it to his work at the Union Tribune.


Loewy's Rack of Lamb with Shallots and Mustard
